### **International Solidarity with the Myanmar People!**

We condemn the recent execution by the Myanmar military junta of four political prisoners.

We fear the possibility that the junta will take such unconscionable action again unless the utmost pressure is exerted. We are scholars and researchers from around the world who would like to add our voices to the growing wave.

We are appalled by the ongoing despicable inhuman actions of the Myanmar military junta. We deplore not only the recent execution of four political prisoners and the cruel and inhuman treatment of them and their families. But we also deplore the ongoing violent rampage and murderous assault indiscriminately waged on the people, including the children, elderly and infirm, in villages, towns and cities across the country, in an insane attempt to bludgeon them into submission.

We deplore the ongoing willful destruction of homes, farms, clinics and schools, and the deliberate assaults on food provisioning and humanitarian assistance efforts by local people trying to help each other and especially those worse off to survive the junta's brutalities.

We deplore the continuing attempt by the Myanmar military junta to cling to power by whatever means.

We stand in solidarity with the people of Myanmar, who continue to resist as much as possible with dignity and determination, the oppression and violence visited upon them by the illegitimate and murderous Myanmar military junta. We stand in awe of your courage and commitment to resist what is wrong and to insist on what is right by any standard of decency.

We commit, as individuals, to do whatever we can in our own locations, to put pressure, however we can, on our own governments to recognize the will of the people and to take meaningful action in support of their struggle for freedom from military rule and for the chance to build a society based on genuine democracy, justice, and peace.

With this statement, we seek to add our voices to the choir of existing calls already made condemning the actions of the military junta, and to send our condolences and share our strength especially to all the brave people struggling on the ground in Myanmar -- you are not forgotten or alone!

### **Solidaridad Internacionalista con los pueblos de Myanmar**

Condenamos la reciente ejecución de cuatro presos políticos por la Junta Militar de Myanmar

Tememos a la posibilidad de que la junta repita una acción tan inadmisibles a menos de que se ejerza la mayor presión. Somos investigadoras/es y académicas/os de todo el mundo, que quisiéramos sumar nuestras voces a la ola creciente de solidaridad.

Estamos abrumados ante las continuas y despreciables acciones inhumanas de la junta militar en Myanmar. ### **Solidarité internationale avec le peuple de la Birmanie (Myanmar)!**

Nous condamnons l'exécution récente par la junte militaire de la Birmanie de quatre prisonniers politiques.

Nous craignons que la junte n'entreprenne à nouveau des actions aussi inadmissibles en l'absence d'une pression internationale accrue. Nous sommes des universitaires et des chercheurs du monde entier qui voulons ajouter nos voix à celles qui s'expriment déjà.

Nous sommes consternés par les actions méprisables et inhumaines de la junte militaire du Myanmar. Nous déplorons l'exécution récente de quatre prisonniers politiques et le traitement cruel et inhumain qui leur a été réservé ainsi qu'à leurs familles. Nous déplorons également le déchaînement de violence et les attaques meurtrières menées sans distinction contre la population, y compris les enfants, les personnes âgées et les infirmes, dans les villages, les villes et les agglomérations du pays, dans une tentative insensée de les soumettre.

Nous déplorons la poursuite de la destruction délibérée de maisons, de fermes, de cliniques et d'écoles, ainsi que les attaques délibérées contre les efforts d'approvisionnement en nourriture et d'assistance humanitaire déployés par les populations locales qui tentent de s'entraider, en particulier les plus démunis, pour survivre aux brutalités de la junte.

Nous déplorons la tentative continue de la junte militaire du Myanmar de s'accrocher au pouvoir par tous les moyens.

Nous sommes solidaires du peuple de la Birmanie (Myanmar), qui continue à résister autant que possible, avec dignité et détermination, à l'oppression et à la violence que lui inflige la junte militaire illégitime et meurtrière. Nous sommes impressionnés par votre courage et votre engagement à résister au mal et à insister sur ce qui est

juste selon toute norme de décence.

Nous nous engageons, en tant qu'individus, à faire tout ce que nous pouvons où nous vivons, à faire pression, de quelque manière que ce soit, sur nos propres gouvernements pour qu'ils reconnaissent la volonté du peuple et prennent des mesures significatives pour soutenir sa lutte pour se libérer du régime militaire ; et pour avoir la chance de construire une société basée sur une démocratie, une justice et une paix véritables.

### تضامن دولي مع شعب ميانمار!

نددين قيام الطغمة العسكرية في ميانمار مؤخرًا بإعدام أربعة معتقلين سياسيين. نخشى احتمال أن تتخذ الطغمة العسكرية الحاكمة إجراءات غير معقولة كهاته مرة أخرى ما لم نمارس أقصى الضغوطات. نحن جامعيون وباحثون من جميع أنحاء العالم نود أن نضيف أصواتنا إلى موجة الضغط المتنامية. لقد رَوَّعنا الأعمال الدنيئة واللاإنسانية التي تقوم بها الطغمة العسكرية في ميانمار. نحن لا نأسف فقط لإعدام أربعة سجناء سياسيين وللمعاملة القاسية واللاإنسانية لهم ولعائلاتهم. ولكننا نستنكر أيضًا الهيجان العنيف والمستمر وكذلك الاعتداءات القاتلة التي يتم شنّها بشكل عشوائي على الناس، بمن فيهم الأطفال وكبار السن والعجزة، في القرى والمدن في جميع أنحاء البلاد، في محاولة مجنونة لإجبارهم على الخضوع. نحن نأسف للتدمير المتعمد للمنازل والمزارع والعيادات والمدارس، والاعتداءات المُدبِّرة على جهود توفير المعونات الغذائية والمساعدات الإنسانية من قبل السكان المحليين الذين يحاولون مساعدة بعضهم البعض - وخاصة أولئك الذين هم أسوأ حالًا - من أجل النجاة من وحشية الطغمة العسكرية. إننا نأسف للمحاولات المتواصلة من قبل هذه الطغمة العسكرية في ميانمار للتشبث بالسلطة بأية وسيلة كانت. إننا نقف متضامنين مع شعب ميانمار، الذي يواجه مقاومة - قدر المستطاع وبكل كرامة وتصميم - لقمع وعنف الطغمة العسكرية غير الشرعية والقاتلة. نحن نقف وقفة احترام وإجلال لهذه الشجاعة والالتزام بمقاومة الشر والإصرار على القيام بما هو صواب بأي معيار من معايير اللياقة. نلتزم، كأفراد، ببذل كل ما في وسعنا في مواقفنا، للضغط كيفما كان ممكنًا، على حكوماتنا للاعتراف بإرادة الشعب وأخذ إجراءات هادفة لدعم نضالهم من أجل التحرر من الحكم العسكري، وللحصول على فرصة لبناء مجتمع قائم على الديمقراطية الحقيقية والعدالة والسلام. من خلال هذا البيان، نسعى إلى إضافة أصواتنا إلى جوقة الدعوات الرّاهنة التي تم إطلاقها لإدانة أعمال الطغمة العسكرية، وإرسال تعازينا ومشاركة ثباتنا وتضامننا خاصة مع جميع الأشخاص الشجعان الذين يناضلون في الميدان بميانمار - نقول لهم/ن أنتم/ن لستم منسيين ولستم وحدكم!

### Solidaritas Internasional Untuk Rakyat Myanmar!

Kami mengutuk eksekusi empat tahanan politik yang dilakukan baru-baru ini oleh junta militer Myanmar.

Kami khawatir terhadap kemungkinan bahwa Junta Militer Myanmar akan Kembali melakukan tindakan serupa, kecuali jika kita dapat memberikan tekanan kuat kepada Junta. Kami, para akademisi dari seluruh dunia hendak menyuarakan keprihatinan kami kepada situasi yang sedang berkembang saat ini di Myanmar.

Kami dikejutkan oleh tindakan tidak manusiawi dan tercela yang terus berlanjut dari Junta Militer Myanmar. Kami menyangkan tidak hanya terhadap eksekusi empat tahanan politik yang dilakukan baru-baru ini dan perlakuan kejam dan tidak manusiawi terhadap mereka dan keluarganya. Tetapi, kami juga menyangkan tindakan kekerasan yang sedang berlangsung dan serangan pembunuhan tanpa pandang bulu yang dilakukan oleh Junta Militer pada orang-orang, termasuk anak-anak, orang tua dan lemah, di desa-desa, kota-kota besar dan kecil di seluruh negeri, dalam upaya untuk memukul rakyat agar tunduk pada pemerintahan Junta.

Kami menyangkan perusakan rumah, pertanian, klinik, dan sekolah yang disengaja oleh Junta, serta penyerangan

yang disengaja terhadap penyediaan makanan dan upaya bantuan kemanusiaan oleh penduduk setempat yang mencoba membantu satu sama lain untuk bertahan hidup dari kebrutalan junta.

Kami menyanggah upaya Junta Militer Myanmar yang terus berlanjut untuk mempertahankan kekuasaan dengan cara apa pun.

Kami berdiri dalam solidaritas dengan rakyat Myanmar, yang terus melawan sekuat mungkin dengan martabat dan tekad atas penindasan dan kekerasan yang menimpa mereka oleh Junta Militer Myanmar yang tidak sah dan juga pembunuh. Kami kagum dengan keberanian dan komitmen rakyat Myanmar untuk terus melawan yang salah dan menuntut keadilan dengan standar kemoralan yang ada.

Kami berkomitmen, sebagai individu, untuk melakukan apapun yang kami bisa di wilayah negara kami sendiri, untuk menekan pemerintah kami untuk mengakui kehendak rakyat Myanmar dan mengambil tindakan yang berarti dalam mendukung perjuangan rakyat Myanmar untuk kebebasan dari kekuasaan Junta Militer, serta membuka kesempatan untuk membangun masyarakat berdasarkan prinsip-prinsip demokrasi sejati, keadilan, dan perdamaian.

Dengan solidaritas ini, kami berupaya untuk menambahkan suara dukungan kami kepada seruan yang telah ada sebelumnya untuk memberikan kecaman atas tindakan Junta Militer, serta untuk menyampaikan belasungkawa dan berbagi kekuatan terutama kepada semua orang pemberani yang berjuang di lapangan di Myanmar -- Anda tidak dilupakan atau sendirian!
